ABSTRACT

East Market Street, a well-known business street on the edge of North Carolina Agricultural and Technical University, has undergone many transitions and changes within the last century. Dedicating its service to many Black-owned businesses and North Carolina A&T students, East Market Street is famously known for past and present shopping centers for essential living that included groceries, beauty salons, movie theaters, etc., and community institutions like local churches. Over several decades, East Market Street's appearance and businesses have changed along with its role in the Greensboro community.
